



Novelist Sung J. Woo

Talks about his new Book *Everything Asian*

After the talk, Sung will answer questions about his novel, his own story and the process of writing and having his first book published. The Friends of the Hunterdon County Library will be selling copies of the book which Mr. Woo will autograph.

The story of *Everything Asian* is the story of Sung's own life. Like the protagonist David Kim, at 10, he emigrated to the U.S. from South Korea with almost no knowledge of the English language to reunite with his father. He spent most of my adolescence working in a similar gift shop; according to Mr. Woo, just about everything else in the novel is fictitious.

Sung J. Woo's short stories and essays have appeared in *The New York Times*, *McSweeney's*, and *KoreAm Journal*. A graduate of Cornell University with an MFA from New York University, he lives in Washington, New Jersey.
